Cliffs Of Moher

Physical Features: Lakes, rivers, mountains, beaches etc.

The cliffs of Moher are sea cliffs located at the southwestern edge of the Burren region in County Clare, Ireland. The cliffs are about 14 kilometres long. Looking out from the top of the cliffs you will see many coastal landforms such as Sea stacks, Sea Stumps and caves that have formed as a result of erosion. These features are regularly populated by many different types of birds, up to 20 different species. The cliffs have been featured in many movies including Harry Potter. On a clear day views such as the Aran Islands, Loop Head, Galway Bay and the Basket Islands can be seen.

Amenities or facilities available

The admission ticket to the Cliffs of Moher covers a lot of onsite attractions such as, family friendly walkways, a visitors centre, cafes and gift shops. There are also areas that are wheelchair and buggy friendly

Tourist attractions

The Cliffs of Moher themselves are the tourist attraction. The rocks that make up the Cliffs of Moher were formed over 300 million years ago. This dates back to when Ireland's ancient rivers laid down sediments on the seabed to form rocks which have become today the Cliffs of Moher.

Transport into and out of the area

You can get direct bus connections from Galway Bus station to the Cliffs of Moher and on to Ennis along the Wild Atlantic Way on the Bus Eireann 350 route. Buses are also available from Shannon, Dublin, Cork and Knock Airports.
