The Aran Islands are 3 rocky isles guarding the mouth of Galway bay, in western Ireland. They are known for their ancient sites. The largest island, Inishmore, is home to the prehistoric fort of Dun Aonghusa, perched on top of a high cliff. Nearby is the wormhole, a rectangular natural pool. The medieval ruins of the seven churches are in the northwest.
